

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION

UNPLANNED EVENTS



Course Overview

This 2 hour course is a condensed version of our one-day Traffic Control and Protection course, based on the Ontario Traffic Manual OTM Book 7. This course focusses only on unplanned events, such as an emergency where traffic may need to be directed away from an incident, first responders, or their equipment. This course was developed with first responders in mind, but will also be of value to other municipal and utility workers who are required to attend an emergency scene until a proper traffic control plan can be implemented.

The course can be delivered at your location to reduce costs, and is suited to groups of between 20 and 35 participants.

Who Should Attend:

- ▶ Firefighters
- ▶ Police
- ▶ Water operators who respond to watermain or sewer breaks
- ▶ Hydro and other utility workers who respond to downed wires and poles

Learning Objectives:

- ▶ Understand the legislation that applies to Traffic Control / Protection
- ▶ Understand requirements/guidelines of OTM Book 7 (Unplanned Events), OHS Reg. 851 Section 20 and Fire Services Section 21 Advisory Notes.
- ▶ Be aware of the hazards and risk factors related to traffic control during emergency situations, and the purpose of temporary traffic control/protection.
- ▶ Be familiar with the use of Traffic

Control Persons (TCP) and Signalers—the legal requirements for training, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), where they should be located and how they should signal and communicate.

Evaluation/Documentation:

Theory exam (multiple choice) and/or oral exam by instructor. Each successful participant will be provided with a certificate of completion.
